



Courtney Kennaday graduated in 1989 from the University of South Carolina School of Law. Working in both large and small law firms – as an attorney, a law librarian, and a director of information technology – she shared her enthusiasm for technology with other lawyers. She authored the first article about the Internet to appear in the South Carolina Lawyer magazine, in 1996. She served as Chair of the South Carolina Bar Technology Committee from 1997 to 1999, during which time the Committee assisted the Bar in developing its Web page and in clarifying the ethics rules pertaining to email communications with clients.

She continues to write and lecture on technology and ethics topics for lawyers, speaking to lawyers across the state and across the country. In 2007, she appeared at the Missouri Bar Solo and Small Firm Conference, the largest in the country. She appeared as a speaker at ABA TECHSHOW® in Chicago in five separate years. She is a member of the ABA Law Practice Management Section, where she was Vice-Chair of the Computer and Technology Division, and is a member of the ABA General Practice, Solo and Small Firm Section. Currently, she co-authors a regular column for lawyers, *Sites for Sore Eyes*, which appears in both the ABA GP Solo magazine and the online Technology eReport.

She has been the Practice Management Advisor of the South Carolina Bar since 2002. In her position as PMA, she advises Bar members on technology, office management, and ethics. Her PMAP (Practice Management Assistance Program) web pages are among the most visited on the SC Bar website and were recently ranked number five by the ABA in the top six best state Bar resources in the country.
