

Principles:

- The people as the ultimate source of authority of government
- People working in government are the servants of the people, not their masters
- All people must obey the laws
- The powers of people in government are limited to protect the rights of the people
- The powers of government are separated among different branches
- Different branches of government can stop other branches from breaking the laws limiting their powers
- No people are deprived of their rights just because of their sex, religion, language, nationality, or being in the minority
- The courts can stop other branches of government from doing things that break the laws limiting their powers and/or unfairly deprive people of their rights.
